PASTOR PETE'S ARTICLE



Siblings in Christ, the return of that time-honored tradition of Spring is about to return. No, I'm not talking about baseball, but it is great to have that going again. Nope, I'm not talking about March Madness, the end of Daylight Savings time, or the running of the smelt (I grew up in Ashland, on Lake Superior, where the smelt run was almost as popular as deer hunting season.) I am talking about the return of Lent!! Specifically, the Lenten Suppers and Worship Services. It is once again time to gather on Wednesday nights to break bread and worship together!!! I love this time of year because it gives me another chance to grow as a community in Christ.

This year, for the suppers, I would like to try something a little different. For the past couple of years, we have asked people to sign up to bring in soups that are made from home. This year, I am asking people to help make the food here at the church. I will gather the ingredients and then we can work together to prepare the food. You might notice that I'm not saying soup each time, that's because I want to give us the freedom to try different things. One week might be soups, the next week some hot dishes (yes, I call casseroles that because I lived in Minnesota for way too long), and who else knows what. Part of it will depend on the weather and our budget.

The way we will do this is that we will have signup sheets for cooks, servers/clean-up, and dessert makers. Keep your eye out on Sunday mornings for that clipboard to be passed around. The cooking will be done on Wednesday, and we will post the schedule for our "cooking classes." Times will vary depending on the menu. The biggest reason why I would like to try this is for food safety concerns. You won't need to worry about having to make soup and then figure out how to transport it to the church while making sure it maintains the proper temperature. Also, there is a community built by preparing food together and there is something wondrous about serving your neighbors with food and love.

After we have broken bread, we will go upstairs to the sanctuary for a Taizé worship service. It came out of Taizé, France, a city that has an ecumenical Christian monastic community. It is made up of Christians from different denominations and their worship services often include songs that have a simple phrase that is repeated in a simple melody. It is a way to help us focus on God as we pray. We often incorporate Taizé worship into the Prayers of the People on Sunday mornings. It is a peaceful and contemplative worship service, and we invite you to join us on Wednesday nights in Lent.

Now, when does all of this start? Ash Wednesday will be on Wednesday, March 5th and we will start with supper at 5:30 to 6:30 PM. Worship will begin at 6:30 PM and the service will probably be about 30 minutes. Please, come and join us for a time of food, fellowship, and faith on Wednesday nights this Lenten season.

Also, I invite you to find a spiritual practice for Lent. For some, it's adding in prayer or meditation, and for others, it's a time to give something up, to help you remember Christ and the sacrifice that he will make for us. It can be as simple or as complex as you like. I pray that the Lord blesses you on your Lenten Journey!



The Heart Story:

Founded in 2012, Heart Response Ministry began with a simple mission: to support local officials and organizations as they work in their communities during disaster recovery. Since then, HEART volunteers have started to focus not only on disaster recovery but on other real needs within our communities. By partnering with over 170 non-profit organizations, and city and county governments, police departments, and schools, HEART's goal is to build relationships with local organizations to meet the spiritual and physical needs of their communities. We transform communities by getting the right goods into the right hands to distribute to the people in need that our non-profit partners serve. Heartland Outlet serves as one of the primary funding mechanisms for HEART. The outlet is open to the public 20 hours a week and carries home improvement products, food, beverages, clothing, furniture, and so much more.

Children, Youth & Family News

Kingdom Kids is a program for our elementary-age youth that is usually on the first Wednesday of the month. For March, it will be on Wednesday, March 12th because the first week of March is Spring Break. The program has kept us hopping with over 40 children each time we host it. It is almost like a mini-day of VBS, where the kids are dropped off at the church by a school bus and they have a snack. We then have a Bible lesson followed by games, activities, and arts and crafts. We wrap it up with a music session with Missy and Ava where they practice a song that they will usually sing the following Sunday. It is an action-packed hour and a half! And we are always looking for more helpers. Talk to Pastor Pete if you have any questions.

Sunday School starts on Sunday mornings at the end of the service after the children have received communion or a blessing. We have two high schoolers who take turns teaching Sunday School, Katie and Piper and we are so grateful for them! The exciting thing for this Spring is that the EASTER BASKETS are coming back! The kids will assemble the Easter Baskets on Sunday, March 30th during their Sunday School time, and then on April 6th, they will go to the Ellsworth Care Center and Preferred Senior Living to deliver the baskets to the residents. They will leave right at the start of the worship service after the congregation says a quick word of prayer to bless the children and the baskets. This is a great way for our children to bring some sunshine to our community!

Confirmation has wrapped up its teaching sessions for the year. They will still gather on Wednesday nights during Lent for their mentor sessions after worship. It will be a time of guided discussion where a student is paired with an adult from our congregation so that they may grow in faith and community.

Luther Point Bible Camp We invite all our youth to partake in the joys of bible camp! The Ellsworth area ELCA churches are coordinating to send their youth to LPBC during the week of July 13-18th. There are a multitude of programs available for youth of all ages. Check out www.lutherpoint.org for more information and to see what programs are offered.
