

# PASTOR PETE'S ARTICLE



One of my favorite shows lately is "The Bear." It tells the story of a Chicago family and their restaurant's journey. I will admit, it is fairly accurate with the amount of swearing and cursing that the actors say when compared to a real restaurant. It is a fascinating glimpse into a restaurant and the extremely dysfunctional Berzatto family that runs it.

One of my favorite episodes is from the second season title "Fishes." It is a flashback to five years earlier, where the family gathers for a Christmas Eve feast called the "Feast of Seven Fishes." It is an Italian traditional Christmas Eve meal that has seven different seafood dishes, which one of the children says, "No one even eats it." But there is mom, Donna, slaving away in the kitchen. She is drunkenly preparing the feast and many of the scenes take place in the kitchen. The kitchen is a mess as Donna has seven different dishes going at the same time, while she is drinking her wine and smoking cigarettes. After Donna is done cooking, the family gathers around the table and the family members continue the fight that have been having all night long. Donna blows up, tells everyone off with a lot of curse words and storms off. The family looks at each other says, "That took longer than expected." They continue with their fight and are ready to come to blows when suddenly, Donna crashes into the house with her car. And that is where the episode ends.

Chaos, anxiety inducing chaos is the only way I can describe that episode. And I think that Christmas and the holiday season can be that way for many of us. We must make sure that we get everything just perfect. On Thanksgiving, we must make sure that the turkey is cooked perfectly with all the trimmings including all the dishes that have been added on throughout the ears. Even Auntie Vi's weird pea salad that no one particularly likes. But we continue with all the traditions because that is what they are. Traditions root us in the past. But perhaps they hold us back as well. If we try to keep all the traditions, we focus so much on them that we cannot make room for new events. Many of the traditions that we keep hold us captive to the past. We need to be set free.

And that is what we will be celebrating in December, when Jesus Christ enters the world and sets us free from the traditions and sins of the past. When that little baby was born, God sent us a savior to save us from the shackles that we place upon ourselves. We do not need to stress ourselves and prepare a meal for the Berzatto family that no one will eat anyway. We just need Jesus and to focus on him and thank God for sending us his precious gift.

I look forward to celebrating the Advent and Christmas season with you. We will be telling the story of Jesus birth in several different ways throughout the month of December. Most Sundays will be loud and boisterous, but on Wednesday nights, we will have a chance to be quieter and more contemplative. On Wednesday nights at 7:00 PM in December, we will have worship using the Holden Evening Prayer Service. It will be a time of song and reflection as we prepare our hearts for the coming of our Lord. And before that, starting at 6:00 PM, I'll prepare supper for you. I have not worked out the menu yet, but it will be a simple, hearty meal to warm you up on a cold December evening.

A Recovery Meeting in the Ellsworth Area at English Lutheran Church on Thursday nights at 6:00 p.m.


Read and Discuss "Staying Sober"

Members present: Pastor Pete, Greta Larson, Mark Groen, Jill Hague, Paul Tonsager, and Denise Hager

The Mission statement was read by all

Devotions were given by Pastor Pete

Added new business to tonight's meeting. Motion made by Paul to approve tonight's agenda and the previous month's minutes. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mark.

#### Reports

**Finance report** was given by Paul. He is in the process of getting bids for insurance on the church property. We may have inspectors here to measure or requests for more information from them. Money from the Fair Stand Account will be transferred to the other church accounts as needed. Motion to approve the report was made by Jill and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Denise.

**Pastors Report** given by Pastor Pete. A question has been raised as to whether our AED equipment has been checked recently. It will be checked to see if we are on a schedule for that. We have had 2 funerals lately with 11 so far this year. Piper has requested permission to use the church for her annual bake sale.

**Property Report.** Dave has changed the furnace filters for Fall. The committee will be getting bids on additional air conditioning for the lower level. The leaking faucet in the kitchen has been repaired.

Worship and Music. The music schedule from now until the end of the year has been completed.

**Children, Youth and Family.** As of now there are 10 to 12 youths in confirmation. May change after Confirmation on October 27th. The Sunday school has a good group this year.

**Stewardship Report.** There were approximately 45 people that attended the Stewardship brunch on Sunday. Time and talent request sheets will be included in the Sunday bulletin.

**Endowment committee report.** The committee will meet next month. If anyone has a request, they should submit it before they meet. We will be giving out the Thanksgiving baskets again this year, so please let us know of needy families.

#### **Old Business**

The kitchen renovation was discussed. A group that is interested will meet with Pastor Pete. Some ideas were discussed at the last funeral when the kitchen was used. We discussed the replacement of the foyer carpet. Bids from the local floor installer and from Malmquist flooring will be requested.

#### **New Business**

We discussed the tension with the last funeral and the Senior Center. It seems that the issues have been resolved. A notice will be placed on our website and on Facebook for a custodian as Julie Baggenstoss is retiring effective November 1. The Schulze's have been replacing the church banners for the last 10 years and will be retiring from that. Volunteers will be needed to continue. It was decided to approve Piper's bake sale in December. The price of the beef for the Stewardship dinner should be about the same as it was for the Fair Stand. Will be able to print tickets here in the church office. A deadline to request takeout orders will be decided on at the next committee meeting.

The Lord's prayer was recited by all. Motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Denise and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Paul. Next scheduled meeting will be Tuesday November 19<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm.
