

### PASTOR PETE'S ARTICLE



Fall is an amazingly bizarre time of the year. The leaves of the trees change from green into brilliant colors that are beautiful. The fields are ripe with crops. ### **Time and Talents**



The Meeting called to order by President Greta Larson at 6:30 pm

The Mission statement was read by all

Devotions were given by Pastor Pete

Added new business to tonight's meeting. Motion made by Lynette to approve tonight's agenda and the previous month's minutes. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Paul.

### Reports

Finance report was given by Paul. At this time the Fair Stand made \$30,311.00. The cooler at the stand needs work. Should be able to be repaired instead of replaced now.

Motion to approve the report was made by Jill and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Lynette.

Pastor's Report given by Pastor Pete. Discussed the first Conference meeting of St Croix and Pierce Counties. The Senior Center has moved in and seems to be going smoothly,

Property Report. The remote doorbells have been installed and are working well. The new toilets for the building were purchased and have been installed. One of the faucets in the kitchen sink is leaking and will need to be replaced.

Worship and Music. Missy is back now, and a meeting will be called. The fall schedule is set until the end of October.

Children, Youth and Family. The kickoff for Rally Day was held and was successful. Sunday School will begin next Sunday. We have 2 teachers for the kids. Confirmation will begin next Wednesday. Kingdom Kids will begin on the first Wednesday in October.

Stewardship Report given by Lynette. Working on the Dinner planned for next February. Discussed seatings. Tickets can be printed in the Church Office. Paul reported we should be able to get the roast beef from his suppliers. They were not sure about a price until closer to the date and the amount we will be needing. A committee of people interested in helping will be set up, and plan to meet next Wednesday at 6:00. Time and Talent sheets will be printed up like before and passed around during services.

Endowment committee didn't have a report.

### **Old Business**

The kitchen renovation was discussed. Jeanette Wright and Bev Greeley would like to be in on the planning. We need to have an idea of what is needed and required before we go to a Kitchen Designer to get bids on the project.

### **New Business**

We discussed the carpet in the front foyer and hall of the church. It was agreed it is stained and worn and should be replaced. Due to the high traffic area, we discussed putting in vinyl plank flooring instead of carpet. Motion was made to send this suggestion to Property Committee. Motion made by Lynette and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jill.

Nancy Ellefson's funeral will be held here at the church. First test of the Senior Center.

Our insurance with Nationwide is not being renewed in December. We need to get bids from other insurance carriers.

The Lord's prayer was recited by all.

Motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Lynette and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Paul.

Next scheduled meeting will be Tuesday October 15<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm.
