PASTOR PETE'S ARTICLE



"In the bleak Midwinter"

Next time you are in church and have a moment, crack open the red ELW hymnal and check out hymn #294. It is a Christmas hymn with a Debbie Downer name "In the Bleak Midwinter." It is from a poem that an English poet, Christina Georgina Rossetti, wrote in 1872. I do not remember hearing it until I was in seminary, doing pulpit supply at my home church for the first Sunday after Christmas. Pastor Paul picked it to be the Hymn of the Day, the song we sing after the sermon. It is a slow and morose-sounding song. It did not seem to fit with the joyful feeling of the Christmas season. For the second service, I asked the organist to switch it to "Joy to the World" and she gladly obliged.

I do not know about you, but I really struggle with the shortened amount of sunlight that we see from early November through February. By the time Advent rolls around, I am driving to work in the dark and driving home in the dark. It is always dark. It is always bleak! Where, oh where is the light?

It is no wonder that we celebrate Jesus Christ's birth on December 25th, right at the time that the days are the shortest. We are celebrating the fact that a new light has come into our world. During the bleak dreariness of winter, we get to celebrate Christmas! Christmas is a time for remembering the good ol' days, celebrating today, and looking forward to the days that are to come. There is lots of light, music, goodies, and color! Oh, the colors; all the greens, reds, golds, silvers, and even some blues! It is such a wonderful and colorful time of year. And musical too!

But what if we go back and look at the words for that bleak song? The first verse lays it all out, the earth is bleak in the middle of winter. Winter is cold, and it hardens the earth like iron and water is like stone and the snow keeps falling. But then comes Jesus, who is mighty and powerful because he is the son of God, but where is the first place that he lays down his head? It is a simple stable that holds Christ. They place him in a lowly manger.

For me, "In the Bleak Midwinter" is a beautiful song because the final verse ties up the hymn-like a Christmas package under the tree. It asks, "What can I give him, poor as I am?" What on earth do I have to offer to Jesus? If I were a shepherd, I could offer up a lamb. Its wool could keep him nice and warm in the bleak midwinter. "If I were a wise man, I could give him a gift." The three Magi from the East brought gifts for Jesus. But I have nothing to give him, nothing at all, except my heart. All I can offer is my heart and that is all of me. And that is the best gift of all that we can give to him, our hearts, which are what truly matter.

In this bleak midwinter, let us offer up our hearts to Christ, celebrate all that he has done for us, and love our neighbors. Amen.

Meeting called to order at 6:30 pm by President Greta Larson.

Mission statement was read by all.

Agenda was changed to move the Insurance presentation from Kris Flock before other business. Motion to accept new agenda made by Paul and 2nd by Lynette. Motion to approve October minutes was made by Denise and 2nd by Dennis.

Reports

Stewardship report given by Lynette. There will be 2 seatings for the February Beef dinner. One will be from 11:00 to 12:00 and the other from 12:30 to 1:30. January 18th was set as the date to make pies for the event and gravy making to be done on February 20th.

Endowment report. The committee met and had 11 requests for funds. One request was pended for further information and the rest were approved.
